

Sight Sciences' Conflict Minerals Policy

Sight Sciences supports the goals of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 and is committed to responsible sourcing of conflict minerals from the Democratic Republic of the Congo ("DRC") and adjoining countries. Conflict minerals refers to certain minerals and derivatives - cassiterite, columbite-tantalite (coltan), wolframite and gold, and their derivatives, tin, tantalum and tungsten – that may, directly or indirectly, finance or benefit armed groups in the DRC or adjoining countries.

As directed by Section 1502, the U.S. Securities and Exchange commissions adopted rules to implement reporting and disclosure requirements in response to the violence and human rights abuses in the mining of "conflict minerals" from the Democratic Republic of the Congo ("DRC") or adjoining countries. Sight Sciences will conduct supply chain due diligence regarding conflict minerals that are necessary to the functionality or production of a product manufactured or contracted for manufacture and that originate in the DRC or adjoining countries (including: Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, the Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda & Zambia).

Sight Sciences has developed a conflict minerals program in accordance with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas and the supplements thereto. We expect our suppliers to have policies and programs in place to conduct responsible conflict minerals sourcing within their own supply chains in accordance with the OECD Guidance. We require our in-scope suppliers to promptly provide us with a current Conflict Minerals Reporting Template upon request and demonstrate that they are working to source conflict minerals from smelters and refiners that have completed an industry-standard third-party audit.

We will continue to monitor global developments around sourcing minerals and work with our suppliers to continually improve our conflict minerals program.
